Haiku, a traditional form of Japanese poetry, consist of three lines. The first and last lines contain five syllables; the middle has seven.

"If writing a haiku is good preparation for writing a novel, as Roland Barthes pointed out, the reader will find many novels here. Not to mention many moments they will savor and identify with."
